**Students admitted into the DC Spring program select 12-15 credits from this list of courses depending on what best fits their academic plan for graduation. Selected courses are taught within the context of the DC program – there is no additional coursework associated with enrollment. All students engage in the same DC program curriculum regardless of course selection. While in DC, students complete the established program curriculum to earn a single grade. At the end of the semester that grade (or Pass/No Pass) is applied to all courses in which each student is enrolled.*

Due to the unique structure of this program, it is strongly recommended that students discuss and select DC program courses in consultation with their academic advisor.
